And he said, "I am Jesus, whom you are persecuting. ⁶ But rise and enter the city, and you will be told what you are to do." ⁷ The men who were traveling with him stood speechless, hearing the voice but seeing no one. ⁸ Saul rose from the ground, and although his eyes were opened, he saw nothing. So they led him by the hand and brought him into Damascus. ⁹ And for three days he was without sight, and neither ate nor drank.

Open: When have you seen someone decide to follow Jesus whom you never expected would do so?

Read & Discuss: Acts 9:1-19

- 1. What do verses 1-2, 13-14 tell us about Saul's personality and his attitude toward Christians? Have you ever encountered someone who was hostile toward Christians? How did you react?
- 2. Based on verses 3-5, how would you say Jesus views the persecution of his followers? What various factors in this surprising event might have radically changed Saul's perspective? Why do you think God chose to use this approach with Saul?
- 3. How might the events surrounding his conversion have been in Saul's mind when he later wrote 2 Corinthians 4:6, "For God, who said, 'Let light shine out of darkness,' has shone in our hearts to give the light of the knowledge of the glory of God in the face of Jesus Christ."? If this is how Saul describes his conversion, what words would you use to describe your conversion?
- Given what he's heard about Saul, Ananias is clearly afraid of making contact with Saul (vv. 13-14). Have you experienced fear in approaching someone to whom God was leading you? What do we usually fear about sharing the Gospel with someone who might not receive it well?
- 5. How would you summarize God's plan for Saul in verses 15-16? How do you think these words from God might have helped Ananias to overcome his fears? What helps you to overcome your fears when God asks you to do something potentially risky?
- 6. What do you imagine Saul might have been thinking and feeling after this experience? What are some ways the decision to follow Jesus caused immediate change in yourself or in someone else you know?

Apply: How are you challenged or encouraged by what you observe in this chapter?

Pray: Share some names of people whom you particularly have trouble believing would ever decide to follow Jesus. Spend some time praying for the salvation of those people.
