Open: Share about a time when you celebrated the completion of something.

Read & Discuss: Nehemiah 6:15-19

- After the wall around Jerusalem was completed, in verse 16, Nehemiah says their enemies "perceived that this work had been accomplished with the help of our God." From what has happened in Nehemiah so far, what are some ways we've seen God help them with this task? What are some tasks you've completed where you felt a clear sense of help from God?
- 2. Besides the fact that the Israelites had received the help of God, what else might Israel's enemies have perceived about their God? What should we want those who oppose God's work today to come to understand about God? What could we do that might help them see God in this way?
- 3. Nehemiah 6:17-19 make clear that opposition to Nehemiah had not stopped even after the wall was completed. How do you think Nehemiah may have felt by this ongoing opposition? What do you think kept Nehemiah going, especially given that the wall was already complete? What helps you keep going when your spiritual opposition seems unrelenting?

Read & Discuss: Nehemiah 7:1-7, 66-73

- 4. What does Nehemiah appear to be concerned about for Jerusalem now that the wall has been rebuilt (7:1-4)? What temptations and challenges might work against establishing a healthy city under these circumstances? What is Nehemiah's strategy for moving forward?
- 5. In 7:5, Nehemiah says God put it in his heart to enroll the people by genealogy. Why might God have wanted Nehemiah to do this? What ways do genealogies in Scripture prove helpful to us? How are you impacted by your own family's genealogy?
- **Apply:** What are some specific ways God has blessed you? How might you use those blessings to help others know and experience the blessings of God themselves?
- **Pray:** Pray that we would live in such a way that God and His ways are made known through us. Ask God to help us leave a legacy that future generations would aspire to live up to.

⁶⁶ The whole assembly together was 42,360, ⁶⁷ besides their male and female servants, of whom there were 7,337. And they had 245 singers, male and female. ⁶⁸ Their horses were 736, their mules 245, ⁶⁹ their camels 435, and their donkeys 6,720.

⁷⁰ Now some of the heads of fathers' houses gave to the work. The governor gave to the treasury 1,000 darics of gold, 50 basins, 30 priests' garments and 500 minas of silver. ⁷¹ And some of the heads of fathers' houses gave into the treasury of the work 20,000 darics of gold and 2,200 minas of silver. ⁷² And what the rest of the people gave was 20,000 darics of gold, 2,000 minas of silver, and 67 priests' garments.
